

#### What are Booklet Labels?



The term Booklet Label is the symbolic name for all label constructions designed to expand a product's copy space.

The classic Booklet Label is comprised of a booklet or pamphlet that is married to a pressure sensitive label. There are many other names for Booklet Labels: Foldout Labels, Extended Content Labels, Expanded Content Labels, Expanded Labels, ECLs, Extended Text Labels, Multi-Panel Labels, Multi-ply Labels, Label with Pages, and Multi-Page Labels to name a few. Don't be confused by all the terms. They essentially mean the same thing. Sometimes people use the term Booklet Label to mean it's a stapled booklet rather than a pamphlet that folds out.

### **Foldout and Booklet Specs**

- An offset printed booklet or pamphlet laminated (or glued) to a die cut pressure sensitive base label.
- The pamphlet or booklet can be printed with unlimited colors including 4 color process.
- The smallest booklet label is approximately .5"  $\times$  1.25" (3/4" folded pamphlet). The largest is 12"  $\times$  18"
- Glued or stapled spine for booklets.
- Maximum page count for booklets is 112. Maximum unfold for pamphlets is 36"
- The pressure sensitive base label is made of paper or film and can be printed up to 8 colors including 4 color process.
- Permanent, removable, and low temp adhesives available.
- Produced on rolls for manual or automatic application. 20" maximum outer roll diameter. 3" or 6" cores.
- One time opening or multiple open and resealable feature.
- Options- Bar coding, variable numbering, die cut tabs, back numbering, and piggy back labels.
- No minimum quantity.
- Lead time average: 10-15 days depending on complexity and options.



#### **27 Ways To Customize Your Booklet Labels**



**1. Die cut "Peel Here" tab**: Makes it easier to open the booklet label.



**2. Printed base label**: If the booklet is removed, the base label keeps your product identified. "leave behind label"



**3. Over-laminate lying directly on the liner** (see arrow): This makes the booklet label easier to form around a curved surface.



**4. Variable coding**: You can add a unique 12-16 digit code to identify each booklet label.



**5. Irregular shaped booklet label**: Die cut both the shape of the label and the booklet to fit shaped containers.



**6. Map fold:** We can produce a booklet label with a right angle folded piece that opens like a "map".



**7. Booklets:** Customers like booklets because they feel they're easier to use.



**8. Foldouts**: Are less expensive than booklet labels.



**9. Clear base label:** Believe it or not there is a label on the box. When you don't want to cover up important information, use a clear base label.





**10. Small rolls:** We can produce as few as 25 booklet labels per roll for easy distribution.



**11. Sheeted:** Designed for easy manual application and distribution.



**12. Glued spine:** Glued spine presents a cleaner look.



**13**. **Stapled:** Allows us to produce thicker booklet labels and create designs that carry printing through the spine.



**14. No over-laminate:** Traditionally booklet labels have a laminate. We glue it to the base so it doesn't need to be laminated.



**15. Leaflet glued to base label:** Some customers prefer having the leaflet glued to the base label as an extra measure to keep the leaflet from being removed.



**16**. **Encapsulate:** We can put a plastic sheet with a 4 side seal on your booklet label. Customers like this because it keeps the contents contamination free.



**17**. **Booklet to the side:** Create one large label with both a booklet label and main product label. Best solution for round containers.



**18. Coupon perf:** We use a perforation to make coupons easier to tear off.





**19. Specialty perforation:** We make this perforation so that the laminate will break at the perf. This keeps any codes printed on the laminate from being torn off.



**20**. **Synthetic paper:** Turn your booklet label into a more durable label with synthetic paper - moisture resistant.



**21. No base label:** We laminate directly to the liner. This creates a construction that can be bent around a pencil.



**22. Very small booklet labels:** We can make very small booklet labels to fit the smallest containers. This one is .5" x 1.5" with 30 printable pages. We can make booklet labels smaller than 1" in both directions.



**23. Neck Hangers:** Sometimes, customers prefer having the information hang off the container. This 120 paged booklet was converted into a Data-Necker.



**24**. **Multi-ply Labels:** When customers need to add a little more information than their single ply label will handle, a 2 or 3 ply label often makes the most sense.



**25. Resealable adhesive strip:** In this method, we apply a low tack adhesive strip. We combine it with gluing the booklet to the base label to create a construction that doesn't need an over-laminate.



**26. Multiple Inserts:** If you don't want to combine all the information into one booklet, you can offer multiple independent printed pieces.



**27.** Combine give-aways with booklet labels: We combined a hang tag with a pet supplement give-away. There are infinite ways to combine widgets with booklet labels to add value to your products.

### **Questions About the Project**

- What is the project for? (Pharma, Chemical, Promotional, other)
- What is the booklet label going on? (bottle, box, bag, other)
- What is the surface material? (plastic, glass, metal, other)
- Is the surface textured or smooth?
- Will the booklet label be applied to a round, square or flat surface?
- What is the application temperature? (room temp, refrigerated, freezing, cryogenic freeze)
- o If a liquid, what is the temperature of the liquid during filling?
- What is the maximum/minimum temperatures that the booklet label is going to exist in?
- Is there a booklet label construction on our product's section that inspired you?
- When do you need Booklet Labels in house?



#### What About Specs?

- Quantities? How many versions?
- Do the booklet labels have to be automatically applied? If yes, what is the application unwind number?
- What is the size of the booklet label? Measure north and south and then east and west (Height x Width). We call this measurement the "die strike".
- Do you want a foldout or a booklet? If a booklet, is it stapled or glued?
- How many printed pages? If you provide us with the copy, we can estimate how much space it will take.
- How many printed colors? (Cover- Inside pages-On the base label)
- o Is the base label film or paper?
- Permanent or removable adhesive?
- Maximum outer diameter size of the roll?
- or 6" cores?
- Do they need the booklet label to be re-sealable?
- Does it need a tab?
- Is there a special code that needs to be printed or do you need to have it receptive to code printing? (Barcodes-Consecutive numbering-Variable numbering)
- Is a special liner needed such as poly?
- o If manually applied, do you need small rolls or sheeted?



## **What About Artwork?**

- Illustrator, Indesign, PDFX
